Profile of the College

The college came into being on 1st June 1944 as MAHARANI MAHILA college through mahila education society (registered body of the then prominent and respectable women of Jammu) at the instance of MAHARANI TARA DEVI. It was taken over by the Govt. of JAK on 25th November, 1953 and was renamed as Govt. College for Women Parade, Jammu. It continued to be the only women college of Jammu province upto 1971. Located in the foot hills of "Mata Vaishno Devi and shores of sared "Suryaputri Tawishi" in the old Jammu city area this is the only college in Jammu Province that offers the largest number of courses ranging from Arts to Science and Commerce to B.C.A with 29 subjects and 66 combinations available to the students. A total of 6500 students are pursuing their degrees in various disciplines including PG in Home Science (Community Resource Management L Extension) and Music. The college has been sanctioned a certificate course in Fashion Designing and Technology under Community College Scheme by UGC. The college has faculty strength of 118 permanent teachers. As higher education has to be commensurate with market demand for placement of students, this college has aptly received Grant in aid from UGC for Career Oriented Courses. This college has been acting as a platform for organization of national and state-level seminars to sensitize the latent talent within students.

Pre-Admission Guidance and Counseling Cell

Pre-admission counseling shall start from 5th of June, 2017.

The college has constituted Guidance and Counseling Cell for Admission to guide the students in the process of seeking admission and selection of the right course in compatibility with their abilities. The students can approach the members of this cell also for information regarding Add- on- courses. The application for Add-on- courses shall be submitted along with the Admission form.

Admission Process

- Submission of Pre-Admission Application form online: Candidate will be required to fill
 Pre-Admission Application form online and submit it along with the required
 documents within the stipulated time as per the notification.
- After submission of Pre-Admission application, Merit list will be displayed on the college notice board and will also be uploaded on the college website.
- Admission forms will be filled by the candidate and submitted along with the required documents.

Admission Criteria

- The minimum eligibility for seeking admission in this college shall be 50% for the Science and 45% for the Arts and Commerce Streams.
- Re-appear cases in 12th Standard are not eligible for admission.
- A student who has passed Higher Secondary Part-II examination (Class 12th) of the J&K Board/CBSE or any other equivalent examination, in all subjects, is eligible for admission
- Student will be eligible to take up any subject provided the candidate had taken up the same subject in Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) or an equivalent examination in the following:
- a) Biology as a subject in 10+2 to be eligible to take up Botany or Zoology or Biotechnology
- b) Mathematics and Physics as subjects to be eligible to take up Electronics.
- c) Mathematics as a subject to be eligible to take up Mathematics/BCA
- d) To be eligible to take up Commerce Stream the candidate is required to have:
 - i) Commerce Stream in the 10+2 Class. If not 50% as aggregate in other subjects.
- e) To be eligible to take NCC as a subject

i) The Candidate should have done 'A' certificate in NCC in 10+2

ii) Candidate will be selected on the basis of merit.

Students who have taken Mathematics as a subject in 10+2 to be eligible to take up Computer Application

g) Students who have taken as a subject Home Science as a subject in 10+2 to be eligible to take up Textile Dyeing and Designing.

h) For taking Geography as a Subject preference will be given to students who have Geography in 10+2. Eligibility for taking Geography is 60% marks or above in aggregate.

Admission fee is non-refundable

Change of subjects/stream is not encouraged but in case any difficulty is faced, the student will be allowed to change the stream/subject combination within one week after the commencement of classes.

Add on Courses/Diploma/Certificate Course

These are career oriented courses which run parallel to the conventional B.A/B.Sc./B.Com & B.C.A courses. Hence are known as Add on Courses/Diploma and Certificate courses. The objective of these courses is to provide a student with a Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma in any of these career and market oriented courses along with a conventional degree, by the time she leaves the portals of this college. These are aimed at bridging the gap between degree and the job.

The courses include practical work that is for the development of skill and hence are market oriented and are run in collaboration with different industries, research institutions and prospective employment agencies.

The career oriented courses are UGC approved and the Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma will be awarded to students, after successful completion of the courses.

Each course has been introduced with a progressive approach during the first, second and third year of academics as Certificate/Diploma & Advanced Diploma respectively.

ii) Eligibility

Students of this college pursuing their conventional B.A, B.Sc.,B.Com & B.C.A degrees are eligible for seeking admission to these courses. The programme runs parallel to conventional degree courses & demands following eligibility for admission.

 Certificate Course: B.A, B.Sc., B.Com & B.C.A Semester 1st students of this college are eligible for undergoing the certificate course.

 Diploma Course: B.A, B.Sc.,B.Com & B.C.A Semester 3rd students of this college who have passed Certificate course examination in Semester-Ist are eligible for seeking admission to Diploma course.

Advanced Diploma course: B.A, B.Sc., B.Com & B.C.A Semester V students of this
college who have passed Diploma course examination in Semester 3rd are eligible
for undergoing Advanced Diploma course.

Although the courses will not be watertight compartments, students of any discipline can join a career oriented course of a different field to diversify her knowledge. Counseling will be offered for right selection of the course in the interest of students, taking course suitability and student's capability into account.

Vocational Course

The college runs two vocational courses, viz.,

A. Secretarial Training: A complete unit of steno training centre has been created for imparting Secretarial Training to students to increase their job prospects.

B. Functional English

Facilities Available On The Campus

Dr. Krishna Mohan Girls Hostel

The college provides accommodation in the hostel to its students who hail from far off places. Due to constraint of limited accommodation the admission to the hostel is made on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination. In case two or more applicants fall in the same merit, preference will be given to those with lowest family income on the basis of income certificate issued by employer or tehsildar. However some seats are reserved for the wards of Indian Army personnel, Central Govt. employees and students belonging to SC/ST category.

On selection for admission to the hostel, students shall be required to submit certificate in support of their place of residence, duly signed by employer of their parent or first class magistrate. Students suffering from any chronic infectious disease are not eligible for hostel accommodation. Gap cases are also not eligible for admission to hostel.

The Principal, in all matters, has the discretion to accept or reject the request for admission to the hostel and in no case a student can assert her claim.

The intake capacity of the Hostel is 250 students

Admission to the Hostel

Application for admission to the hostel shall be made by the student on the prescribed form, available with the college office, duly filled and submitted to the Office.

Applicants are required to submit three passport size photographs along with the application form.

Documents Required for Admission to the Hostel.

- Photocopies of Mark List of qualifying examination
- Income Certificate from the competent authority
- Medical Certificate for Fitness
- Photocopy of Category Certificate issued by competent authority, if applicable.

Facilities in the Hostel

The following facilities are available to students in the hostel:

- Well ventilated, shared accommodation, each room provided with 3 beds.
- Mess arrangement

Hostel Rules

The students are required to follow the below mentioned rules in the hostel:

- No student shall change her allotted room without the prior permission of college administration.
- Boarders are not allowed to leave the hostel even to live temporarily elsewhere unless permitted by the competent authority on the written request by the parent.

- In the event of any emergency that demands the boarders to leave the college, they are required to sign in the register and give details of such a need. Strict disciplinary action will be taken for not reporting back in time. They will also record their arrival on their return.
- The warden is authorized to check the students in their rooms any time she deems fit.
- Parents are required to stay in touch with college authorities and visit their wards once a month if possible.
- The name of the boarders remaining absent continually will be struck off.
- In case of illness the hostel warden should be informed.
- Boarders are required to vacate hostel during vacations.
- Ragging in the hostel is strictly banned.
- . Best hosteller award will be given to the student who has an impeccable behavior.
- Indiscipline of any nature will be dealt with strictness by the college authorities. The warning will be issued by the competent authority. If it goes unheeded, action under rules will be initiated. Further insensitivity to discipline will lead to expulsion of the boarder from the hostel by the competent authority.
- Visitors are not allowed to visit the students in their rooms. No guest is allowed to stay overnight.
- During holidays and other vacations boarders must lock the room and keep the keys with the warden.
- Students are required to take proper precautions of their belongings. The management shall not be responsible for any loss.
- The cost of any damage of the room, furniture or facilities provided therein arising out of improper use shall be borne by the student.
- Applicants are required to submit a list of expected visitors, duly signed by the parent/guardian and three passport size photographs of the visitors, along with the application form.
- Amusement of any kind, which is likely to disturb others, is not allowed.

Mess Rules

- At the time of admission to the hostel two months fee will have to be deposited in advance wherein one month fee will be adjusted in the last month of the session.
- Mess charges are to be paid in advance up to 10th of every month. A fine of Rs.10/- per day will be imposed after the due date.
- Students will not be allowed to stay in the hostel and dine in the mess if they fail to pay the dues within 1 month.
- Students are required to pay all the dues before they vacate the accommodation during vacations. They will not be readmitted if they failed to do so and their security will not be refunded.
- After the production of NOC from the hostel warden, External Examination Roll No. Slip will be issued.
- All the hostel students ought to stay in the hostel till their last examination of the current session and pay the mess fee for the entire session.
- Students who leave the hostel before end of academic session shall not be eligible to get their hostel security refund and will not be readmitted in the hostel in the next academic session.
- Hostel mess will be managed by the inmates of the hostel on rotational basis

Room Maintenance

- Students are responsible for proper maintenance of rooms and the furniture provided therein.
- Proper bedding shall be brought by the students themselves.
- Use of electric heaters, electric kettle and other electric appliances is strictly prohibited.LED bulbs to be used
- Boarders will make sure that lights and fan are switched off on leaving the room. Negligence in this regard can result in expulsion from the hostel.

Dining hall

- No meal shall be served outside the dining hall.
- Students are required to come in proper dress to the dinning hall (night dress, bathroom sleepers are not allowed).



Library

The college has a well established automated and digitized library for the undergraduate, post graduate students and the faculty. The library is the resource center that supports and enhances the curriculum of the college. Students can expand their horizons more effectively with a digitalized and automated library which has about ten computers. Teachers reinforce their classroom instruction with assignments that guide students to research opportunities within the college



library. The library functions on an open access system for the faculty members and the students. It has a collection of about 68,000 books and a number of volumes of periodicals, journals and magazines in various disciplines of Science, General Knowledge and Humanities. Services such as lending of books, reading room, reprographic facilities and other information are rendered by the library.

 Besides, the facility of Book Bank enables the students to borrow books on long term basis.

Library rules

- The College library is open for students and staff during the college hours on all working days.
- Students are allowed to issue only one book at a time which has to be returned within 7 days.
- Complete silence is to be observed in the college library and in the reading rooms.
- Students are directed to handle books properly. Any body found misusing the library books/library journals/magazines etc. is punished under rules.

- If a borrowed book is lost, torn or damaged, the student responsible for it will be liable to replace it or pay double the cost of the book.
- Every student at the time of borrowing books from the Library shall present to the Librarian her borrower card. The card is issued by the Chief Librarian
- Every student on being admitted shall be issued an "Identity Card" which she shall carry with herself all the time and shall produce on demand while in college. In case of loss of ID Card the student has lodge an F.I.R and a fine of Rs. 100/- shall be charged.

Canteen

A canteen is run in the premises of the college that functions during the working hours of the college and provides eatables at reasonable rates.



Dispensary

All the students are provided with facilities for first aid medical care and treatment in the college dispensary. Only minor ailments are dealt with in the dispensary with the help of a qualified pharmacist.



Well Equipped Laboratories

The College has well equipped laboratories in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Electronics and Psychology, Functional English, Home Science and B.C.A. There are number of computers with Internet facilities for the students of this college.

Zoological Museum

The Zoological Department has set up a Museum of various preserved animal specimens, stuffed animals, charts, models etc.

Botanical Garden

A variety of medicinal and herbal plants of different families are grown in the botanical garden. The mixed flora is grown and preserved for Botany labs.



Drinking Water

There is a facility of Water Cooler and Purifier in the college campus. Water Coolers are connected with purifiers so that students get cool and purified water.

Parking Facility

College has limited Parking area and two wheelers of the students can be parked within the campus provided they have a driving license and proper documents of the vehicle.

Extra-curricular Activities

Extracurricular activities form the core of a student's life since they help to develop an allround personality of the students to face the undaunted task and turbulent world of future. The aim of extracurricular activities is to make the students fit for the future and to develop a competitive spirit, co-operation, leadership, diligence, punctuality and team-spirit as well as to provide a backdrop for the development of their creative talents.

The college provides a number of indoor and outdoor Sports and games facilities to the students and suitable awards are given every year to the best performers. Besides sports and games, the college has following activities:

National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) aims at arousing social consciousness of the youth with an overall objective of personality development of the students through community service. The college has 4 units, having one Programme officer and 100 students in each unit. They are required to extend 120hrs of social service per year besides participation in two camps organized by the NSS unit of the college. Students are given certificates by University of Jammu for rendering service in the field. The activities include: Improvement of campus, constructive work in adopted villages and tree plantation.



National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps in India is a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools and colleges The Cadets are provided military training in small arms and parades.

The aims of NCC are: To develop qualities of character, courage camaraderie, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service amongst the youth of the country. To create a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide



leadership in all walks of life and be always available for the service of the nation. To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces. The students get enrolled with the in-charge of the NCC unit of the college.

Youth Red Cross Unit

The College took an initiative in the establishment of "Youth Red Cross Unit' under the auspices of Indian Red Cross Society with the objective of providing, awareness to society regarding health related issues.



Tours and picnics

A number of tours and picnics are organized in college to the places of educational and historical importance. Students are selected for the tours on the basis of merit. Subject tours in Commerce, Botany, Home Science and Zoology are also conducted within the State.



Formation of Clubs

The College has set up various literary clubs like Languages club, Science club, Behavioral Science club, Commerce club and BCA club which organize various programs like guest lectures, seminars, quiz competitions, related to diverse fields, throughout the year for students and faculty members on a routine basis. Various events like poster making, slogan writing, rallies, lectures and symposia are arranged from time to time. Field trips to villages are also organized with the mission of spreading environment awareness.

Sports Activities

The College has a well developed play field with defined courts for various games Students participate in various sports activities.



Cultural Activities

The students participate in various cultural activities, especially from the Music Department. Students participate in State and National Level programmes and have brought laurels to this college.



Student Presidium

The students of the college benefit from the liberty and sovereignty to have their own presidium that acts as a representative body to have a participatory role in various activities of the institution. The elections for the Student's Presidium are facilitated by the Student Welfare Committee in the presence of its Dean and under the overall supervision of the Principal.

Ban on Ragging

- Administrative Action in the event of Ragging
- Suspension from attending classes and Academic privileges.
- Withholding/Withdrawing Scholarship/ Fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ Examination or other Evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any Regional National or International Meet, Tournament and Youth festivals etc.
- Suspension/Expulsion from the Hostel.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters/ Annual Course.
- Cancellation of Admission.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from Admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Filling of First information Report (FIR) with the police and local authorities, under appropriate penal provisions.
- Providing that where the persons, committing or abelting the act of Ragging are not identified, the University shall result to collective punishment.
